THE PETITIONER RESPECTFULLY SUBMIT AS UNDER:

1. MPSEZ Utilities Limited (hereinafter referred to as "MUL" or "Petitioner") (Formerly known as MPSEZ Utilities Private Limited) is a company incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956 having its registered office at Adani Corporate House, Shantigram, Near Vaishno Devi Circle, S.G. Highway, Khodiyar, Ahmedabad-382 421.
2. The Hon'ble Commission in exercise of the powers conferred under section 61, 66, 86 (1) (e) and 181 of the Electricity Act, 2003 (36 of 2003), has made the Gujarat Electricity Regulatory Commission (Procurement of Energy from Renewable Sources) Regulations, 2010 for promoting the sale of power from renewable energy sources and procurement of energy from renewable sources by distribution licensee within the state of Gujarat vide its Notification No. 3 of 2010 dated 17.04.2010 (herein after referred as RPO Regulations). In the RPO Regulations, the Hon'ble Commission has specified the minimum percentage for the procurement of power from Wind, Solar and Other Sources for the period from FY 2010-11 to FY 2012-13.
3. Subsequently, the Hon'ble Commission has issued the Gujarat Electricity Regulatory Commission (Procurement of Energy from Renewable Sources) (First Amendment) Regulations, 2014 vide notification no. 2 of 2014 dated 04.03.2014. The Hon'ble Commission has fixed the RPO targets for the

obligated entities through the aforesaid regulations for the period from FY 2010-11 to FY 2016-17.

4. The Hon'ble Commission has notified the Gujarat Electricity Regulatory Commission (Procurement of Energy from Renewable Sources) (Second Amendment) Regulations, 2018 vide notification no. 1 of 2018 dated 21.04.2018. The Hon'ble Commission has fixed the RPO targets for the obligated entities through the aforesaid regulations for the period from FY 2017-18 to FY 2021-22.
5. The Hon'ble Commission has notified the Gujarat Electricity Regulatory Commission (Procurement of Energy from Renewable Sources) (Third Amendment) Regulations, 2022 vide notification no. 1 of 2022 dated 08.04.2022. The Hon'ble Commission has fixed the RPO targets for the obligated entities through the aforesaid regulations for the period from FY 2022-23 to FY 2024-25.
6. The RPO target specified by the Hon'ble Commission to be fulfilled by the obligated entities during FY 2022-23, as per Gujarat Electricity Regulatory Commission (Procurement of Energy from Renewable Sources) (Third Amendment) Regulations, 2022, are as under:

7. The Petitioner has achieved RPO of 12.38% against 17.00% stipulated in GERC (Procurement of Energy from Renewable Energy Source) (Third Amendment) Regulation, 2022 for FY 2022-23.

7. The Petitioner respectfully submits that it has made the necessary arrangements to fulfill its non-solar RPO by entering into long term power purchase agreement with Wind Turbine Generators (WTG). The Petitioner has also considered the non-solar attributes allocated by GUVNL as per Gujarat Waste to Energy Policy – 2016 under the "Others" category of RPO. Accordingly, the Petitioner has achieved non-solar RPO of 9.16% against prescribed RPO of 9.00% for the FY2022-23.
8. The Petitioner respectfully submits that it has fulfilled its Solar RPO mainly by using renewable attributes of Solar rooftop Projects which are installed by its consumer's end as per Gujarat Solar Policy – 2015. The Petitioner has also procured solar energy through exchange to fulfill its solar RPO. Accordingly, the Petitioner has achieved Solar RPO of 3.21% against prescribed RPO of 8.00% for the FY2022-23.
9. The Petitioner has achieved an overall RPO of 12.38% against 17.00% as prescribed for the FY 2022-23. Thus, there is a shortfall of 18.53 MUs in the overall RPO fulfillment for the FY 2022-23. The shortfall is due to following issues which are beyond the control of the Petitioner:
- It is to submit that the actual generation from WTGs tied up by the Petitioner in FY2022-23 was reasonably lower by 11.17 MUs with respect to generation in FY2021-22.
 - It is to submit that the actual generation from solar projects installed at Petitioner's consumer end in FY2022-23 was lower by 1.73 MUs with respect to generation in FY2021-22. The RPO attributes of such solar generation are considered towards the RPO fulfillment of the Petitioner as per Gujarat Solar Policy – 2015.
 - From the above, it is clearly evident that there was a substantial shortfall in RE generation of 12.91 MUs on account of lower RE generation from both Wind and Solar resources.
 - Moreover, it is to humbly submit that the Petitioner has tied up wind capacity of 10.4 MW (2 x 5.2 MW) WTG with Mundra Windtech Limited for procurement of Renewable Energy to meet its RPO. The SCoD of the

aforesaid WTG was on 30.06.2022 & 30.11.2022 respectively. However, power supply from one of the WTG has been delayed from 30.06.2022 to 20.08.2023 and another WTG one has also not commenced till 31.03.2023 which otherwise could have contributed to additional generation of 8.59 MUs (at 40% CUF) which could have helped in RPO compliance of the Petitioner.

- e. From the above, it is evident that Petitioner has made consistent efforts to fulfil its RPO obligation and the shortfall in RPO fulfilment is mainly due to shortfall in RE generation and delay in commencement of RE supply which is beyond the control of the Petitioner.
10. Further, the Petitioner would like to submit here that the Petitioner have entered into Power Purchase Agreement with Solar Energy Corporation of India (SECI) for power procurement of 1070 MW of ISTS-connected Wind-Solar Hybrid Power (Under Wind-Solar Hybrid Tranche-V). The approval of tariff adoption has been accorded by the Hon'ble Commission vide its order dated 24.03.2023 in case no 2189 of 2023. This shall further enable Petitioner to fulfill its overall RPO obligation in the near future.
11. The petitioner would like to highlight that the clause 4.1 of the GERC (Procurement of energy from Renewable Sources) Regulations, 2010 and subsequent amendments provides that:

"4.1 Each distribution licensee shall purchase electricity (in KWh) from renewable sources, at a defined minimum percentage of the total consumption of its consumers including T&D losses during a year. Similarly, Captive and Open Access user(s) / consumer(s) shall purchase electricity (in KWh) from renewable energy sources, at a defined minimum percentage of his/her total consumption during a year.

The defined minimum percentages are given in the table.

If the above-mentioned minimum quantum of power purchase either from Solar or Wind or Large Hydro Power Plant of capacity above 25 MW and commissioned after 8th March, 2019 as per MoP, Government of India Notification No. F. No. 15/2/2016-H-I (Pt.) dated 08.03.2019 or Others (including Biomass, Bagasse & Bio-fuel based cogeneration, MSW and Small/Mini/Micro Hydro) is not available in a particular year, then in such

cases, additional renewable energy available either from Solar or Wind or Large Hydro Power Plant of capacity above 25 MW and commissioned after 8th March, 2019 as per MoP, Government of India Notification No. F. No. 15/2/2016-H-1 (Pt.) dated 08.03.2019 or Others shall be utilised for fulfilment of RPO.

In view of above, the Petitioner would like to submit that surplus non-solar RPO of 0.64 MUs shall be adjusted against shortfall solar RPO of 19.18 MUs for FY2022-23.

12. The Petitioner would like to highlight that the clause 4.2 of the GERC (Procurement of energy from Renewable Sources) Regulations, 2010 and subsequent amendments provides that:

"4.2 The Commission may, suo-motu or at the request of a licensee, revise the percentage targets for a year as per clause 4.1 of these Regulations keeping in view supply constraints or other factors beyond the control of the licensee."

Hence, Aforesaid regulation confers powers upon commission to revise the minimum percentage target for purchase of power from renewable energy sources for the FY2022-23.

In view of above, the Petitioner requests Hon'ble Commission to revise solar RPO targets for FY2022-23 accordingly.

Prayers:

In the facts and circumstances mentioned above, it is most respectfully prayed that this Hon'ble Commission may be pleased to:

- a. Consider the submissions as above.
- b. To revise the percentage target of purchase from renewable energy sources for the FY2022-23.
- c. Allow to compensate shortfall of Solar RPO with surplus Non-Solar RPO for FY the 2022-23.
- d. Allow additions / alterations / changes modifications to the submissions.
- e. Condone any inadvertent omissions/errors/shortcomings.
- f. Afford reasonable opportunity of personal hearing before passing any orders in the matter.
- g. Grant any relief/s as it deems fit and appropriate under the circumstances of the case and in the interest of justice.

Declaration that the subject matter of above petition has not been raised by the Petitioner before any other competent forum, and that no other competent forum is currently seized of the matter or has passed any orders in relation thereto.

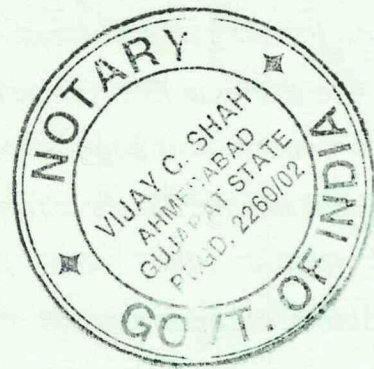
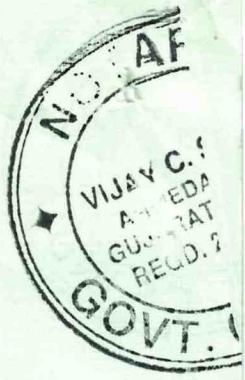


vide daily order dated 27.05.2024. The direction issued by Hon'ble commission is reproduced as below:

"3.2. According to the Hon'ble APTEL's directions, it is necessary to issue a public notice and invite suggestions/objections from all the stakeholders in the matter pertaining to compliance of RPO by the obligated entities. We note that the present Petition is filed for compliance of RPO target percentage from renewable energy sources for FY 2022-23 and to compensate shortfall of Solar RPO with surplus Non-Solar RPO. Therefore, it is necessary to conduct a public hearing to take into consideration the views/comments of stakeholder before deciding the matter. The Petitioner is, therefore, directed to issue a public notice in two daily Gujarati Newspapers and one English Newspaper having wide circulation in the State/National level stating that they have filed Petition No. 2340 of 2024 before the Commission for compliance of RPO target for FY 2022-23 under the provisions of the GERC (Procurement of Energy from Renewable Sources) Regulations, 2010 and its subsequent amendments. The Petitioner is also directed to upload the present Petition with all the documents on its website and invite comments and suggestions from the stakeholders on the petition on affidavit within 30 days from the date of issuance of public notice. 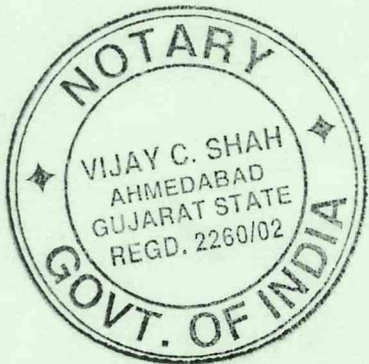

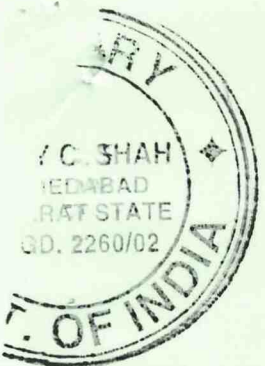

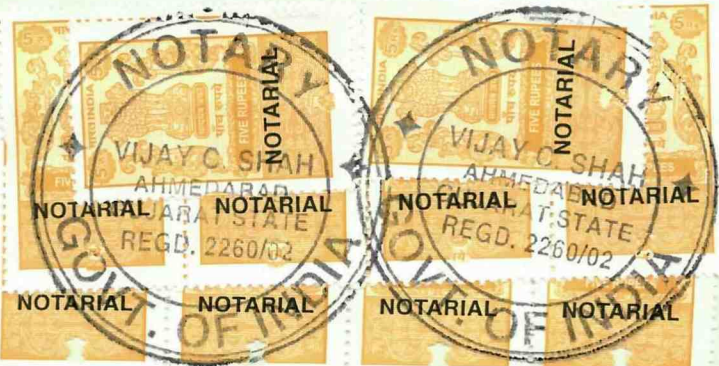

BSF apprehends Pak national for trying to sneak into India

Bhub: The Border Security Force (BSF) detained a Pakistani national on Wednesday morning while he was trying to cross the border fence and sneak into India in Kutch district, an official said. The Pakistani national is being interrogated, the BSF said in an official statement by the BSF after the detention. The man has been identified as 30-year-old Alzal, a resident of Sialkot in Pakistan. Nothing suspicious was found from his possession, a BSF official said. "Around 7.15 am, a BSF sentry spotted a Pakistani man trying to cross the fence and sneak into India. Upon getting the message, BSF jawans rushed to the spot and apprehended the Pakistani national," the official said. PTI

Will watch *Maharaj* in interest of justice: HC amid stay on release

THE GUJARAT High Court on Tuesday had suggested to the court that it is open to the court to watch *Maharaj* in the interest of justice. The court's decision came even as the stay on the release of the movie on Netflix continued for another day. Yash Raj Films (YRF) on Tuesday had suggested to the court that it is open to the court to watch the movie. ordered an interim stay on the release after hearing a petition moved by several followers of the Vaishnava sect who identify themselves as devotees of Lord Krishna. Actor Anamir Khan's son Junaid Khan is making his debut in the movie. The petitioners objected to the release of *Maharaj* on the grounds that excerpts of the movie contain "scandalous and defamatory language, which affects the Pustimargi sect as a whole". They also said the film's release "is likely to incite feelings of hatred and violence against the Pustimargi sect, which would be in breach of the code of ethics under the Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules, 2021".

The movie is reportedly based on a book on the Maharaj libel case of 1862, which was heard and decided by British judges. The case was filed by religious leader Jadhavji against social reformer Karsandas Mulji. Jadhavji filed the case after Mulji claimed in an article, published in a weekly newspaper he edited, that the religious leader had alleged sexual liaisons with his female followers and men were expected to show their devotion by offering their wives for sex. The case was dismissed. On Wednesday, senior advocate Shalin Mehta, appearing for YRF, and Jal Unwala, representing Netflix, suggested to Justice Sanjiv Vishan that the court may view the film and then consider the merits of the

DEMAND FOR MORE BCom SEATS AT MSU

NSUI workers clash with cops during protest; eight detained

EIGHT WORKERS of the National Students' Union of India (NSUI) were detained in Vadodara after they clashed with police during a protest to demand more BCom seats under MS University's Faculty of Commerce. The detainees were released with a warning later in the day. The protest came a day after Vice-Chancellor VK Srivastava announced an additional 1,400 BCom general category seats after growing resentment among students and parents that locals would be left out following the adoption of the centralised online admission portal — Gujarat Common Admission System (GCAS) — by state-run universities of Gujarat. With the announcement, the total number of BCom seats at MSU increased to 7,200. However, the student wing of the Congress has been demanding that the MSU must increase its seats to 9,000 to 5,300. The seats were increased to 5,800 after protests. However, this year, due to GCAS the cut-off has been 75.86 per cent for the general category, which is an issue and several students of Vadodara will be left out to pursue Commerce and have scored more than 50 per cent. "We have demanded that all students from Vadodara, who wish to pursue Commerce and have scored more than 50 per cent, should be granted admissions at MSU. It has always been the case until 2023, when the current Vice-Chancellor decided to reduce the seats from 9,000 to 5,300. The seats were increased to 5,800 after protests. However, this year, due to GCAS the cut-off has been 75.86 per cent for the general category, which is an issue and several students of Vadodara will be left out to pursue Commerce and have scored more than 50 per cent," said NSUI President Amar Vaghela. According to officers at Sayajiraj police station, eight NSUI members were detained for blocking the main road outside the MSU head office and causing traffic disruption. Members of All Gujarat Students Union (AGSU) were also detained by the police after engaging in a face-off with the vigilance officers of MSU during a protest at the head office.

MORBI BRIDGE COLLAPSE

Oreva forms compensation trust, High Court seeks Action Taken Report against officials who erred

THE GUJARAT High Court Wednesday directed the state government to submit a report on the action taken against Morbi municipality officials in relation to the Jhullo Pak collapse in 2022 that claimed 135 people. A division bench of Chief Justice Sunil Agarwal and Justice Pranav Trivedi stated that the report be placed before the court by the next date of hearing scheduled for July 23. Meanwhile, Oreva, which was in charge of the maintenance and repair of the bridge, informed the court that it has registered a trust for the welfare and compensation of the victims — the next of kin of the deceased as well as those injured in the incident — and those injured by opening a bank account with an initial corpus of Rs 15 lakh. The trust — Sahay Seva Parivar Trust, Morbi — was registered following suggestions from the court in previous hearings to support and take care of the needs of the victims, including widows, orphaned children or children left with one parent and those who suffered disabilities, among others.

Senior counsel Nirupam Nanavaty on behalf of the company, informed the bench that the trust has seven trustees, including representatives from the company as well as four government officials. The court recommended that the trustees now sit together and work out a mechanism for executing the proposals of compensation and support to the victims. The court also directed that the minutes of the meeting also be brought on the court's record.

The court sought the Action Taken Report after it, in its order in October 2023, had recorded the state's submission that it would place such a report after the Special Investigating Team (SIT) in the case submitted to its final report on October 9, 2023. However, such a report was yet to be submitted by the state, the court noted. Recording that the contents of the final SIT report had detailed about the lapses on the part of the officers of the Morbi municipality, including the chief officer, the court directed advocate general Kamal Trivedi to submit the said report.

Minister stable after minor brain stroke: Hospital

Ahmedabad: Gujarat minister Bhupendra Patel suffered a minor brain stroke on Wednesday. After he was admitted at UN Mehta Institute of Cardiology and Research Centre in Ahmedabad, hospital officials said he was stable and was under observation. Patel is the minister of state of food and civil supply and social justice and empowerment

department. According to a press note issued by the hospital, Patel was admitted around 9:30 am Wednesday with diagnosis of hypertension. Following diagnostic tests such as MRI, and brain ECG, it was concluded that Patel suffered a minor brain stroke. Patel's diagnosis comes months after Gujarat Agriculture

Minister Raghavi Patel in February was admitted to a hospital in Rajkot after he suffered a brain stroke. Sources had said Patel was in Jamnagar district's Beraja (Pasaya) village as part of the party's 'Goon Chalo' campaign in Gujarat when he fell unwell, following which he was shifted to the Rajkot hospital after being stabilised for two hours.
