

# Battle of cousins: BRS suspends KCR daughter Kavitha from party

'Anti-Party  
Acts, Recent  
Attitude' Cited

**Hyderabad:** The battle of cousins within former Telangana CM K Chandrasekhar Rao's BRS claimed its biggest casualty Tuesday when a disciplinary committee suspended his daughter and MLC K Kavitha from the party for an unspecified period, citing her "recent attitude and anti-party activities".

The implosion, which BJP attributed to a tussle among KCR's kin for the alleged spoils of the Kaleshwaram project scam, came a day after Kavitha publicly named her father's two influential nephews — former minister Harish Rao and ex-Rajya Sabha MP Jogaiah Santosh Kumar — as being among the beneficiaries of corruption.

But for the duo's alleged misdeeds, Justice (retd) P C Ghosh Commission would have found no fault with KCR while inquiring into the suspected irregularities in the Kaleshwaram project, she said.

Her remarks followed Revanth Reddy-led Congress govt's decision Monday to hand over the probe to CBI.

Kavitha formally heard about her suspension from Soma Bharat Kumar, the BRS general secretary who oversees disciplinary matters. Bharat had represented her in court when she was jailed along with AAP's Manish Si-

sued to Kavitha purportedly doesn't provide any detailed reason for the step beyond mentioning she was found guilty of acting against the party's interest. Before the announcement, there was speculation that Kavitha could be expelled after KCR went into huddle with senior functionaries in his farmhouse.

Kavitha's unease over her position in BRS became public in May after a letter she had written to her father was leaked to the media. She subsequently spoke of "ghosts around KCR".

While Kavitha's family, including her brother and former minister KT Rama Rao, remained mum, another ex-minister, Satyavati Rathore, told reporters her "imminent exit" would have no bearing on BRS. Other functionaries said KCR didn't see any difference between his family members in politics and the party's rank and file.

Sources close to Kavitha said she would soon decide on whether to remain a legislative council member or resign. Speculation is rife that she might launch a party.

Telangana BJR chief N Ramchandra Rao said Kavitha's remarks against her own party reflected a family feud over "ill-gotten wealth". Congress said her suspension after an outburst against her own was proof of wrongdoing in the Kaleshwaram case.

## Can person shoot himself in chest with rifle, SC asks MP

**New Delhi:** Is it possible for a person to shoot themselves in the chest with a rifle? SC raised this question while wondering whether the death of a man, who died in similar circumstances, was really a case of suicide as alleged by the prosecution or one of murder.

Hearing a plea against anticipatory bail granted to an accused who is facing an abetment of suicide charge, a bench of justices Manoj Misra and Ujjal Bhuyan sought MP govt's response on whether the case was probed from all angles, raising doubts on police report that it was suicide.

## Scores line up to adopt newborn left in garbage van

**Bhopal:** Her biological parents didn't want her. Now, compassionate strangers are keen to give her a home.

Abandoned at birth, sanitation workers found this newborn girl in a garbage collection van on Aug 29 in Bareli in MP's Raisen district. Three days after she made a miraculous recovery, at least a hundred have come forward, eager to adopt her.

The infant's 30-year-old mother, who had dumped her in a garbage bin, was arrested Sunday. She had given birth out of wedlock and told police the baby's father had forced her to abandon the child. He was arrested Monday.

"The little one's plight shocked and saddened me. I wish to adopt her and give her a happy life," said Rajendra Rai (67), a father of two who runs a hotel in Bareli. He went to the local police station, where officials told him about the adoption process. "I will discuss it with my wife, who has often expressed her wish to adopt. We will travel to Bhopal and apply for adoption if needed," Rai added.

Like him, hundreds have so far reached out to officials, approaching the doctors treating the baby, local police personnel, and Raisen district child welfare committee.

"I have received inquiries from at least a hundred people. Many, including the local corporator, expressed the desire to adopt the girl. I, too, wanted to adopt her as we are a childless couple. To my surprise, there were already so many waiting at the CWC office. Even two nurses of the hospital expressed their wish to adopt her," said Dr Hemant Yadav, block medical officer at Bareli CHC.

"I have been explaining the norms and processes to people from the CWC to the State Adoption Resource Agency," Dr Yadav added.

Police officials, too, are facing queries. "Around a dozen people have approached us. People are reaching out wherever they think they can get help. We are explaining the norms to everyone," said Bareli PS in-charge Kapil Gupta.

## NOTIFICATION GOVERNMENT OF GUJARAT REVENUE DEPARTMENT SECRETARIAT, GANDHINAGAR.

(The Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013) (30 of 2013)

District: Ahmedabad

In exercise of the powers conferred by sub-section (1) of section 11 of the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation & Resettlement Act, 2013 (No. 30 of 2013) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), the Government of Gujarat hereby declares that the land / lands mentioned in the Schedule annexed hereto is / are required for the purpose of acquisition for the public purpose of "Construction of ROB in lieu of L.C. No. 40/B on Varmor-Vitalpur-Detroj-Kadi Road K.m. 0/0 to 36/400 Mehsana-Viramgam Railway Line."

(2) It is notified that -

(1) The area of land / lands required for the above project is H. 00-98-80 Sq.mt, and is at Detroj Village of Detroj-Rampura Taluka of Ahmedabad District;

(2) The public purpose involved in the above project are: For the purpose of construction of the infrastructure project of "Construction of ROB in lieu of L.C. No. 40/B on Varmor-Vitalpur-Detroj-Kadi Road K.m. 0/0 to 36/400 Mehsana-Viramgam Railway Line."

(3) The reasons necessitating the displacement of the affected persons are - Due to acquisition of the Land, specified in the SCHEDULE for public purpose of "Construction of ROB in lieu of L.C. No. 40/B on Varmor-Vitalpur-Detroj-Kadi Road K.m. 0/0 to 36/400 Mehsana-Viramgam Railway Line."

(4) The summary of the Social Impact Assessment Report is as under: Under Section 10A of the Gujarat Act of 12 of 2016, exemption is given under Section 10A of the Act vide Revenue department Government Of Gujarat Notification No: AM-M-2025-146-LAM-142025-351-GH. Dated:03/03/2025 it is not required for the summary of the Social Impact Assessment Report.

(5) The particulars of the Administrator appointment under section 43 of the Act are as under- Prant Officer, Viramgam.

(3) All the persons interested in these lands are hereby notified not to obstruct and disturb any Surveyor or other staff to enter upon and survey the land. Any transaction in respect of whole or part of these lands in whatsoever manner including by sale, lease, mortgage, change of name, exchange entered into after the date of this Notification made without permission of the Collector shall not be taken into consideration by the officer assessing the compensation under section 27 of the Act for a particular portion of the land as may be finally acquired.

(4) The Government of Gujarat, if satisfied about acquisition of the land for aforesaid public purpose, may publish final declaration under section 19 of the Act in this regard in the manner and timeframe so prescribed under the Act. In case the acquisition is dropped partially or entirely, such facts shall be notified in a proper manner as provided under the Act.

(5) In exercise of the powers under clause (g) of section 3 of the Act the state Government is pleased to designate Prant Officer, Viramgam function and discharge the duties as Collector under the provisions of the Act in respect of these lands.

(6) Objection to the acquisition, if any, may be filed by the person interested within 60(Sixty Days) from the date of publication of this notification as provided under Section 15 of the ACT before Collector or Prant Officer, Viramgam.


